



COMMITTEE REPORTS

COUNCIL – December 8

Our Treasurer, Sue Rambeau, reported that our November revenue was \$18,668.98 and expenses were \$15,801.86. Starting in 2016, the finance committee has been asked by council to prepare an update each month for the newsletter, telling the congregation how we stand with finances and how the situation is with our mortgage. At the present, there is sufficient money in the building fund to cover any shortfall in the monthly giving to the fund (about \$345 per month on the average) and pay off our mortgage in a timely fashion, as long as giving doesn't drop off dramatically.

Pastor reported that new council members (James Sebastian, Pam Sauls, Wayne Kauffmann, and Melinda Schall) will be installed at the January 10, 2016 service.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION - December

December meeting was conducted through emails.

The Sunday School children were involved in stories, crafts, activities and Christmas program practice throughout December.

High School youth will continue their various group activities with some changes due to the holidays. On Dec 20th they will watch the movie "Saving Christmas" and will watch the other half on Jan 10th. Youth Night for November was cancelled as the movies available at the cinemas were not ideal. Youth Night for Dec will be Dec 10th - Project Believe for 5th - 12th graders.

The fundraiser with Bob Evans Nov 11th - 16th went well and we received \$109.00 which was deposited into the Youth Fund on Dec 7th. We are discussing what months we should do this fundraiser throughout 2016.

Operation Christmas Child - 54 boxes were collected. Souper Bowl of Caring will be the January Mission of the Month. We will collect change for Project Believe and non-perishable food items for Needy Basket.

Confirmation has been going well. No Confirmation classes Dec 27th and Jan 3rd.

We were invited to a Winter Youth Retreat for 9th-12th graders at Capital University on January 29 & 30, 2016. According to the letter three meals and accommodations in the dorms would be provided by Capital Chapel Ministries. I sent out letters to the youth and have had several interested so I sent for the additional information and the info sent back states there is a \$35.00 cost per student which includes a tshirt and \$10.00 per chaperone. I contacted the person who sent the letters and they said some letters were sent out in error without the charge added. So we have agreed to have the \$35.00 paid out of the Youth Fund and any chaperones that attend will pay their own \$10.00. For Youth Night for January we originally discussed Winter Jam in Columbus, however, I would not be able to attend. We do not have chaperones for that event and we haven't had much interest so Youth Night for Jan will be a movie night on Jan. 15th. Responses and discussions were received back from Jennifer Kauffmann, Heidi Coppock, Susan Pytel, Melinda Schall.

Next meeting will be Jan 19th at 6:30pm.

<u>COMMUNICATIONS/WELCOMING- No Dec. meeting</u> <u>WORSHIP AND MUSIC – No Dec. meeting</u> <u>OUTREACH-SEE WOMEN OF ZION ARTICLE</u> PROPERTY – December 7, 2015

A proposal was received from General Preservation Corporation to restore and repair the brick walls on the old building. There was some concern regarding a clause in the contract regarding liability. Hank Barthel will contact the company to discuss this issue and also contact other churches for whom the company worked.

There was much discussion on concerns regarding the renting of the facilities. The outside door from Walnut St. has been found unlocked on several occasions which is a major concern. Also there are concerns regarding the use of the Audio-Visual equipment in the loft. Outside groups use the equipment, change the settings and then problems result. It was suggested that maybe a committee needs to be reinstated to review contracts before they are finalized and to provide a liaison to any outside group using the facility especially if they will be using the kitchen and/or audio visual equipment to be sure the guidelines are followed and if necessary, be sure the building is secure when they leave.

Security checkers were reminded to be sure the space heaters on the 3rd floor are off, check the stove to be sure all pilot lights are lit and the oven and vent fan are off and spread rock salt if needed at the Walnut St. entrance.

Zion History Corner – Garry Yunker has removed the coat rack over the display case, moved the mirror on the register to the women's bathroom in the basement and hung the original deed for the property on the wall over the register. Bob Keppel has provided a display table for the scrapbook containing many artifacts, old pictures and clippings.

Once again the settings on the console in the audiovisual loft have been changed causing problems with the microphones. Dennis Copeland has worked to solve the problems and all is well. What would we do without Dennis??? Will look at ways to prevent this from happening again.
