

COMMITTEE REPORTS

COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS – March 7

Church council approved the operating income and expenses as of January 31, 2016. January revenue was \$ 16,310.86 while January expenses were 17,195.57. The building fund balance as of January 31, 2016 is \$ 65,039.53. If you want more detailed financial information there are copies on the table as you exit or enter the sanctuary.

Council discussed the upcoming congregational meeting on March 13 and the motion to be voted on at the meeting. The motion is to support church council in entering into a partnership with the Tipp City Enrichment program. The vote will be taken by a yes or no ballot vote. No other business is on the agenda for this congregational meeting.

Council believes our seven ministry committees or teams are serving our mission statement of serving Christ through serving others. The seven ministries are:

Communications/Welcoming 2. Worship &
 Music 3. Christian Education 4. Outreach (WOZ)
 Stewardship 6. Property 7. Finance.

All other teams that existed at one time at Zion have been dissolved by Church Council. A motion was made and seconded and approved to only list these seven committees as the only operating teams at Zion.

Church council discussed the possible approval of a paid Financial Secretary. The Financial Secretary would be responsible for posting all incoming financials every Monday. Church council will work with the Finance team on this motion.

Council approved the transfer of Dale and Ginger Schaefer as new members. Council approved the written request of Hank and Cinda Barthel to be released from membership at Zion Lutheran. We also discussed having a few names of people from Zion that would be willing to show groups utilizing our facility on how to operate the audio/ visual equipment in the fellowship hall.

Jackie reviewed with everyone that the Prek-4th grade will start on the Spring year 2 of Kingdom Quest Curriculum.
