WORSHIP & MUSIC COMMITTEE MINUTES Wednesday, November 2, 2016 @ 1:30 P.M.

In attendance were: Marianne Barnhart, Pastor Jeff Glawe, Deb Keppel, Lori Sebastian, and Ruth White.

Pastor Glawe began with a prayer. We discussed fall music. We switched liturgies to Setting 4. We have received numerous compliments on the prelude moving to after the sharing of the peace. This reduced the talking and

allowed people to prepare their hearts for worship. We will continue this! The choir has resumed singing at Sunday services. The chimes performed in October.

For advent, Ruth White will recruit families to handle the advent candle lighting and special readings. Lori will explore making minor liturgical changes to the service that are appropriate for advent and Christmas. Whatever is selected will be similar through the Epiphany season. During Epiphany, we will utilize the Now, Lord, You Let Your Servant Go in Peace canticle.

We discussed **Christmas Eve and Christmas Day service.** The committee suggests 2 Christmas
Eve services: 5PM and 7:30PM. Communion will
be offered at both Christmas Eve services; the choir
will sing at the 7:30PM service; if we have
adequate kids, chimes will ring at the 5PM
service. Christmas Day falls on Sunday, and service
will be held at 10AM. This Christmas Day service
will be somewhat simplified and focus on carols;
we will not offer communion Christmas Day.

The choir music has been selected through the remainder of the year. Terri has been very flexible in working with the involved people. Comments were made by members how much they enjoyed the choir music Reformation Sunday (Onward Christian Soldiers and Let Faith Be My Shield). Terri will continue giving an explanation of the anthems prior to the choir singing to aid the congregation's focus on the words.

Marianne discussed the altar committee and the commitments. Kudos have been given to Tipp Florist for the fine job they are doing with the weekly flower arrangements. Deb Keppel will help coordinate much of the Christmas preparations: the Chrismon tree, advent wreath set up, banners, manger scene, and poinsettias. Lori will get the battery operated candles ready for Christmas Eve.

Pastor Glawe discussed upcoming events – All Saints Day, annual meeting on November 13th, confirmation/1st communion classes, and a December 11th baptism. Also, we mentioned the community band would be lighting the tree (at Zion) surrounding the community band performance on Friday December 2nd – that is hosted by the Downtown Tipp Partnership. Some discussion was given to the organ fund. Norm Willoughby, the organ technician, believes a good used Allen organ can be found for

\$5,000. A new organ would begin at approximately \$40,000 and go upwards in price. Lori will continue dialoguing with him. She will explore costs associated with moving and installation, to ensure we have adequate dollars in the organ fund to accomplish. We are hoping to replace our existing Baldwin organ sometime late spring 2017 to early summer 2017, pending how the Baldwin continues and pending the right Allen organ becoming available.

Our next meeting will be held Weds. January 4th at 1:30 P.M.
