

SPOTLIGHT ON MISSION OF THE MONTH


January's Mission of the Month

By next spring, a better way to anchor the sign boards out front on Main Street will be accomplished, eliminating the concrete blocks. Bulbs were replaced in the lights on the stain glass window on the north side of the sanctuary. A quilt hanging bar was installed on the wall near the water fountain.

We opened the meeting with an advent prayer.

We discussed Preschool - 6th would learn and review Christmas songs and other spiritual songs throughout the rest of Nov into Dec.


