Terry Bruns from Jeremiah's Letter (the executive director) spoke with us. Jeremiah's Letter began in 1978 to support people living in poverty. They provide meals; help people get documents for employment, medical care, housing, and schooling; provide an adopt-a-family service; help people get household items; provide a clothing room for those that might need something to wear; provide hygiene items for men and women; and various other services. Volunteers are always needed. Programs are funded by donations – goods as well as monetary donations.

WORSHIP & MUSIC MEETING / April 19

On Wednesday, April 19, the Worship and Music Committee met.

<u>Attending were</u>: Terri Darrah, Pastor Glawe, Lori Sebastian, and Ruth White.

We reviewed Lent and Easter Services. All services went well. The "new" Lenten evening special devotional service is something we would like to repeat in future years. Due to low attendance at the morning Ash Wednesday service, we would recommend only offering an evening Ash Wednesday service in future years.

The liturgy changes have been made for Easter: Sundays we are currently singing This is the Feast, Alleluia Verse, Lamb of God, Create in Me, and the "Irish" Thank the Lord. We will stay with this format until Trinity Sunday (June 11th) and then switch to a familiar hymn based liturgy throughout the summer months.

Choir anthems were especially effective during Lent and Holy Week as they mirrored the Scriptures and sermon. Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, and Easter anthems were especially notable. Coming up - Choir Sunday is April 30th. Thanks to the women who are planning a "Choir Sunday" reception following worship. The choir also will plan to sing special music one time during the summer.

Altar is going smoothly. Marianne Barnhart was recognized for her 55 years of service during a recent worship service. Thank you Marianne for your many years of service. Upon Marianne's "retirement", Carla Frame is leading the altar committee. At communion, grape juice is offered along with wine at all services. The palm branches were ordered and based on this year's amount used, we will order 150 palms for both services in the future. There was discussion about whether we would return to Easter with multiple flowers (hyacinths, azaleas, tulips, along with the lilies). The Altar Committee will decide this issue. The white cloth draping the cloth will be left up through Trinity Sunday. Acolytes will be trained to only light the Christ candle during the Easter season.

Pastor Glawe mentioned several exciting upcoming services. Choir Sunday will be April 30th; Pastor will coordinate the readings with the anthems. The special youth-led worship service will be at the roundhouse in Tipp City on May 7th, and Mothers' Day / Confirmation service will be May 14th. Pastor also brought up the possibility of introducing a service of healing at a worship service this summer. We also discussed Light Readers coming in to give their program this summer.

Lori continues to be in contact with our organ technician about the possibility of purchasing a used organ. Once Norm Willoughby contacts us that he has the organs set up (warehouse in Dayton), Lori will take another congregation member along – and look at selecting an appropriate instrument. Lori will re-contact him in April and get a status update.
