

COMMITTEE REPORTS

PROPERTY COMMITTEE: Monday, June 5, 2017

Zion outdoor work day went well but we could have used a few more volunteers. There is still mulch that needs to be put down. The mowing charts are getting filled. Thanks to the generous donation by John and Dianne LeGros, the cemetery and church lawns are looking much better. EverGreen Landscaping is fertilizing and applying weed control.

This committee will be looking for a new preservation company to do the brick work on the west and south walls of the sanctuary building. General Preservation was scheduled to begin work in May, but committee chairperson, Bob Keppel, has been unable to contact them.

James Sebastian installed a portable AC unit for the quilters' area .

The committee decided that the refrigerator in the basement does not need to be replaced at this time. Two additional soap dispensers were installed, elevator was checked, bulbs and ballasts were replaced as needed and the VBS banner was set up on the church lawn on Main St. The sagging ceiling tiles in the sacristy were noted and future repair will be made. **Next meeting: Monday, July 10, 2017**

CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS: June 6, 2017

- 1. Approved May council minutes with slight changes.
- 2. Approved April financials.
- Agreed to send first half \$3,600 to synod for benevolence. Second half of budgeted amount of 7,200 to be sent at a later date.
- 4. Council approved transfer of Birdie Kitchen who moved to Greenville.

- A cooling unit has been installed in the quilting room. Council will monitor to make sure the quilters are comfortable to enhance their ministry.
- Pastor will lead a six week series commemorating the 500th year of the Reformation beginning on Sunday July 9.
- 7. General Preservation Company was supposed to do brick repair work on our building in May. Property Manager Bob Keppel has left several messages for the contractor but they have not returned his calls. Council recommends to the property team that we receive new estimates from contractors since the brick work needs to be performed to keep the church properly maintained. Council member John Greer will relay this request from council to property team.
- 8. We received a \$1,000 grant from the City Of Tipp to use towards the brick repair work.
- Pastor will be on vacation from June 22-27. Pastor Gary Groth will lead the Sunday service on June 25 and will also be available in case of a pastoral emergency. Kristen Zimmann will lead the Saturday service.

- 9. Kathy shared about donations to Wernle Youth Center. Kathy will speak to the pastor at Wernle about speaking here at Zion in 2018.
- 10. Good Sam fund is down. It will be mission of the month in November.
- 11. A Women's picnic was discussed.
