


SPOTLIGHT ON MISSION OF THE MONTH January's Mission of the Month

"With God's Grace" is a mobile food pantry that goes to scheduled locations where people in need in the community can come and receive food and some other small necessities to help members of their household. Every \$1.00 donated = 4 meals. Watch for the BIG RED BOWL in the back of the church starting in January where you can make donations for this wonderful cause. Their motto is: *We show people we care, that they have value, and that they are loved – by us and by God. It is our intention that they receive not only food for their physical hunger, but generous portions of kindness and grace to feed their spiritual and emotional hungers.*
