Sports Items: basketball, football, playground ball


volleyball, ball pump

PROPERTY COMMITTEE / March 5, 2018

- The new sanctuary floor was installed in February. It was necessary to put a new subfloor down which resulted in an additional cost. All of the old pews have been removed.

- A second estimate for parking lot and exterior building lighting was received.

<u>Did you know?</u> If you are taking distributions from a taxable IRA and contribute to Zion, you can make your donations to church tax free by directing your IRA trustee to send a check directly to the church from your account! If you are "better" than 70½, this will even count toward your annual required minimum distribution (RMD). This is a great way to get the biggest bang for your buck and save on taxes. Ask your financial advisor or accountant about Qualified Charitable Distributions. Please note that only IRAs are currently eligible. Other retirement plans such as 401(k)s must first be rolled into an IRA to make direct contributions tax-free.
