We discussed upcoming liturgy. The congregation currently is using Setting IV. During

advent, we will change to Setting I. Thanks to Ruth White who has found readers for the special candle lighting portion of the advent service; we are looking for someone to take those duties over.

Vocal Choir is underway! We had a great turnout to start the season. Terri has pieces selected through November, and has 5 additional advent and Christmas pieces to select to complete 2019. Choir will be off November 4, November 25, and December 9th (Sunday School kids' Christmas program). The choir budget has approx. \$200 remaining for 2018, so Terri can explore a couple of new pieces.

Due to increases in attendance, we will ensure there are plenty of communion wafers and cups prepared for worship. Additional bulletins have also been made. Pastor Glawe reported we are or have received in 33 new members this calendar year! He also stated new member reception is being planned for November.

We are surveying to determine whether there is interest in the 1st through 8th grade children in having a chime choir – potential dates to ring: Thanksgiving weekend, Christmas Eve (early), or a Sunday in January/February 2019.

Planning for festival services is underway. Special thanks to Linda Holt (trumpet) who will be providing special music during Reformation. Zion plans for 2 Christmas Eve Services – times will be 5PM and 7:30PM. Due to increased attendance, Zion also will have 2 Easter services in 2019. Times suggested by Worship and Music (8am and 10am); there is no Sunday School Easter Sunday.

Thanks to the people who provide special music. We are looking forward to Fred Aller and his Pipe Shop (barbershop quartet group) providing acapella music on October 21. We discussed possibilities for November 4 and 25. Then the kids will provide special music during the December 9th and early Christmas Eve services.
