MISSION OF THE MONTH

The Good Samaritan Fund

This fund assists individuals with utility bill help, rental assistance, gas, an emergency hotel stay, etc. No cash is given to the individual. We help in the form of a check to the utility or rental company. A gas card, only good for fuel, is given when needed by an individual. For a hotel stay we work out an agreement with the person in charge. For food assistance we refer them to the Food Pantry. We do keep a list of individuals and their request in order to control repetitive requests.

I enjoy reading especially mystery books by Mary Higgins Clark. I am currently reading a book that talks about the importance of prayer in our faith journey. The book incorporates scripture especially the letters from Paul to help us have a more fruitful prayer life and faith. Paul and the early church believed in prayer as the catalyst to being a person of Godly influence.

Paul's prayers focused not on trying to solve problems but focused more on the inner life of people than on their outer life. In this way prayer becomes more relational than task orientated. Paul believed prayer was most fruitful when prayer was person focused instead of getting things done in a program focused prayer life.

The book I am reading states that prayer is a soulful matter and that without prayer we shall never be able to support souls in their weaknesses. As followers of Jesus we do not need to choose between a contemplative prayer life or an active

life. Author Eugene Peterson says it this way "a prayer life generates and releases an enormous amount of energy into the world, the enlivening energy of God's grace rather than our energy of our pride. In the truest form a prayer life is not an escape from ministry but the living heart of it. Prayer then becomes the root to the tree of holy activity of God in the world".

In summary a life committed to prayer aims to be more God focused instead of me focused. Prayer becomes much more fruitful when it is about my neighbors and my soulful life than it is about improving our life situations. God seeks are inward character transforming our self-centered prayer life to a Godly prayer life. I must admit I don't know how God will answer my prayers but as the apostle Paul reminds us of this reality that we cannot do anything of importance without our Savior Jesus Christ. We do know this sustained prayer has a powerful influence and impact on doing God's work in the world we live.
