We will continue to offer 2 Ash Wednesday services; the 2 Easter Sunday services worked well, and by having the 8am service relieved some congestion and the 2 continuous communion lines at late service went smoothly. Lori thanked Susie for playing for Sunday service and Lenten devotional service in her absence. We are currently using - Setting 3 and will switch to Setting 10 in the summer

Vocal Choir has pieces chosen through rest of the year. Terri stated Choir Sunday will be – May 19<sup>th</sup> with the choir party – Weds. May 22<sup>nd</sup> – Terri's house. Thanks Terri for all you provided both the Easter breakfast and hosting the upcoming choir party.

Deb Keppel updated us with altar concerns. Starting in May we will shift to 2 lines for all Sundays where continuous communion is given. The first Sunday of the month, we will take communion by kneeling at rail. Deb is researching the possibility of purchasing new acolyte robes. Deb also graciously washed the confirmation robes and will fit the confirmands Sunday. Flowers are ordered for both confirmation corsages and Mothers' Day. Donna Slyman is handling the confirmation reception.
