




SPOTLIGHT ON MISSION OF THE MONTH January's Mission of the Month

Souper Bowl of Caring - collecting "change" in the Big Red Bowl for The Ronald McDonald House in Dayton, Ohio. Since 1980, Ronald McDonald House Charities of Dayton has provided a "home-awayfrom-home" for families with hospitalized children, keeping them close by in a stressful time.

Every day, our staff and volunteers welcome worried and exhausted families with open arms. Many families did not anticipate their visit to the House or Family Room, so we strive to meet their needs as they arise.

The fourth weekend of Advent at worship we read from the Gospel of Matthew that Jesus will be called Emmanuel which means God with us. In this Gospel, Joseph, the father of Jesus, finds out that his soon to be bride is carrying the baby Emmanuel who will be called Jesus. Joseph does not understand! How can this be? Meetings are 1st Tuesday of every other month Meeting began with an Advent interactive devotion

Prek-4th grade learned about the 12 symbols of Christmas for the Christmas Program through readings and games. $5^{Th} - 8^{th}$ grade completed studying about the various authoritative figures in their lives and what God teaches us about them through stories in the Bible. $9^{Th} 12^{th}$ grade are working through "The Prayer of Jabez Study for Teens" and should be finished with this sometime in January. Fundraisers and Service – Jackie shared that she had a meeting in Oct for youth interested in attending the 2021 Youth Gathering. Currently 6 youth and 3 adults are interested in attending. General information and fundraisers were discussed in that meeting. Jackie shared the Youth Gathering Fund balance is currently:
