



## **GRIEFSHARE UPDATE**



We have another Saturday Accompanist Allison Cartwright who is approved by council. She will begin in March (the 2<sup>nd</sup> Saturday). Welcome Allison! Norm Willoughy replaced 3 parts and the surge protector on the organ, so it is working appropriately.

Terri Darrah sent in a report for Vocal Choir. Choir music is picked through Easter. Choir will have off March 29, April 5 (Adena Brass is coming in Palm Sunday), and April 26.
