RELAY FOR LIFE

(American Cancer Society)

Due to COVID-19, Miami County's Relay for Life has been postponed. However, cancer has not been postponed or cancelled. American Cancer Society remains committed to the needs of cancer patients. Zion's Relay for Life team (Holy Walkamolies For the Cure) also remains committed to doing what we can to raise money for ACS. As we are able, we will have additional fundraisers. Watch future Tidings and bulletins for information about these.

Hope Lodge facilities normally provide free lodging for cancer patients and caregivers who have to travel to receive the best cancer treatments. In 2019, they provided 500,000 nights of lodging to more than 29,000 patients and caregivers.

However, on March 27, 2020, ACS suspended operations at these facilities because they could no longer ensure the health and safety of the cancer patients. ACS is now using the facilities to provide free lodging for health care workers on the front lines of the coronavirus fight. They provide the workers a place to rest between long shifts or a place to stay if they choose not to go home and risk exposing their families to the virus.
