

What is Operation Christmas Child?

The Samaritan's Purse project Operation Christmas Child collects shoeboxes—filled with school supplies, hygiene items, fun toys and notes of encouragement—and delivers them to children in need around the world to demonstrate God's love in a tangible way.

The Women of Zion have purchased plastic shoebox size containers for the people of Zion to fill with Christmas gifts for children living in poverty overseas. These gifts not only bring hope they bring the Gospel of Jesus to each child through the Samaritan's Purse organization.

Please pick up an empty box (or two) and a <u>"What to Pack"</u> brochure located on the table under the youth board. (or you can use a regular shoebox or buy a container.)

Each packed box must include \$9.00 cash or check made out to Samaritan's Purse placed inside the box for shipping. Do not include: candy, gum, toothpaste, used or damaged items, war related items, seeds, food, liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins, breakable items or glass, aerosol cans.

CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS Sept. 15, 2020

Until further notice there will be no social gatherings after worship services. That will include Consecration Sunday and the annual Thanksgiving Dinner.

1. Council approved minutes from meetings in June and July.

2. Council approved financials from June and July.

3. Council agreed to send first half of benevolence \$2,400 to Synod.

4. Communion services will be the first and third Sundays of the month and will be celebrated on the 4th Saturday of the month with a drive through communion also available immediately after the 4th Saturday service.

5. A confirmation service will be held on Sunday October 4th to confirm Lynnette and Nicholas McKibbin, Anna Johnson and John Sebastian. There will be no reception after the services because of COVID-19.

6. Consecration weekend will be October 10-11 there will be no reception after the services because of COVID-19.

September's Composer of the Month is Sherri Hansen. Sherri's background is in Lutheran churches, but she has worked in other denominations. She sang her first solo at age 5, composed her first hymn at age 9, and started her formal church career by filling in for an organist at Christmas during her last year of medical school. She began composing more seriously in her 20s as a way to help process illnesses of her parents. Hansen was first published by Augsburg Fortress in 2014 (with her Piano Weavings volume 1). She has since written 2 subsequent volumes. She also has a choir anthem in SAB version of Borning Cry. Sherri Hansen studied piano throughout her childhood and college. She created piano scores for Christian song writer Bryan Sirchio in the volume: *Something Beautiful for God*, which is a collection of 22 contemporary hymns. Besides piano solos, she has composed a couple liturgies, several hymns, and choir anthems. She is a Benedictine Oblate (similar to a nun) - someone who studies the ancient Rule of St. Benedictine and then practices those precepts in daily living. She also is a certified yoga instructor.

Hansen has in essence two careers though: medical and musical. She is a doctor and works in private practice as a psychiatrist. She has served as music director of Lord of the Light Lutheran Church for 5 years and then University of Michigan Campus Chapel (where she attended school). She has pursued and balanced two very difficult and different careers.

Composed by Sherri Hansen, the pieces played at Zion in September include: Lord Jesus, You Shall Be My Song, Let All Things Now Living, Create in Me a Clean Heart, In Christ There is No East of West (which incorporated several hymns around the world), A Mighty Fortress is Our God, and Strengthen for Service Lord.

One final note – in January 2020, I had planned to select a composer each month (and music by that composer) so that the congregation would get to hear several pieces by the arranger chosen. The composers chosen for October, November, and December composer primarily for organ, so I will have to delay those composers: Paul Manz, Michael Burkhardt, and Wayne Wold until we return to worship in the sanctuary. I hope you have enjoyed these brief biographies. I have certainly learned a lot this past year about the composers who have shaped the music we hear during our worship experience.
