We at time with God! I know I do!

We all probably need some quiet

time with God! I know I do! I look forward to sharing the Good News of Jesus twice a week with you as I share devotionals. My devotions are posted on the Zion website **ziontippcity.org and on Zion's Facebook page.** Maybe you could start your day with watching one of my devotionals. Past devotions are also posted on the website.

One of my recent devotions was titled TRUTH. I believe we all live by certain truths in our life. As your pastor my truths come from the Bible. I highlighted three truths I live by daily that come directly from Jesus.

The first truth is the world is broken. Humanity and the world are invaded daily by sin and evil. We learn from the Bible as soon as Jesus begins his ministry to the world, he encounters that brokenness. First encounter is a man invaded by evil, second encounter Peter's mother in-law has a fever and then he engages in a crowd that have multiple illnesses. Jesus shares with us the world is broken by sin and evil.

Second truth I live by is that Jesus is with us in the brokenness of the world. These three encounters mentioned earlier has Jesus healing among the messiness of the world. It is important to note in the last episode Jesus does not heal everyone who is broken.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

#### **WORSHIP & MUSIC COMMITTEE**

On Wednesday, January 6, 2021, Worship and Music Committee met. Attending were: Pastor Glawe, Susie Gray, Linda Holt, Deb Keppel, Kervyn Mach, and Lori Sebastian.

Several thank you's were expressed for Christmas and winter services - those who decorated / prepared the altar, our sanitizing team, those who provided special music, our Communion preparers, and our readers and acolytes. Praise was also given individually to people who had gone over and beyond the last few months.

We had several discussion topics. We will hold one Ash Wednesday – on February 17 at 7pm service. For those unable to attend, we will also live stream (YouTube). We also established a devotional service for Weds. March 10<sup>th</sup> at 7pm in the Fellowship Hall. We also discussed future Saturday

musicians. Finally, we reviewed the new hymn supplement from Augsburg Fortress (All Creation Sings). We will initially be purchasing 25 copies, enough for the choir.

Vocal Choir, Bell Choir, and Chime Choir continue to be on hold. We will revisit special music around Easter time. We continue to aim for a shorter (45 minute) service until we are through the pandemic.

For altar information, Deb Keppel reported the Communion schedule is working well - 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Sundays, and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday. Worship and Music committee determined we would also offer Communion January 31 due to Pastor being on vacation in early February. For 2021, there is an altar flower sign up. We also reviewed what we will need for Lent: Pastor has the ashes and will order the palms; Deb will figure out spring bulbs and flowers for Easter and open that to the congregation for purchase.

For the liturgy, we are changing the offertory canticle for Epiphany to Nunc Dimittis. Then we will switch to liturgical setting 3 during Lent and Easter season.
