THE CALL PROCESS

This is an exciting time as Zion Lutheran begins to enter in to the Call Process seeking a Pastor to lead us as we continue to develop and grow as a church family! Zion Church council met with Bishop Suzanne Dillahunt and Assistant to the Bishop Pastor Bob Abrams to review the Call Process and identify the next steps the Council needs to take to get this process underway. The first task to be undertaken will be for Council to begin work on a Ministry Site Profile which is a congregational profile that will be used to help prospective candidates better understand Zion. This includes

In addition, the Council will also be gathering information regarding our community and the surrounding area to share with the pastoral candidates. As we look toward the next phase of implementing a Call Committee we anticipate getting this committee underway sometime during the month of April. We will be updating the congregation on a regular basis as we move through the Call Process.
