

To receive phone calls from Jason, PayTel needs to be funded:

www.paytel.com to set up a prepaid account (whatever \$\$ you want plus a service fee of \$3.00). Calls are about \$0.15/minute and are limited to 20 minutes.

You cannot call Jason directly, he has to initiate the call and you have to accept it. Call comes from 937-401-3613 and the incoming call goes through a series of instructions.

To "email" or set up a video visitation (requires a purchase of credits—sold in increments of 500) cost is \$5.00 per 500 credits + a service fee of \$1.50 Each message costs 50 credits and allows a message of up to 30,000 characters:

Video visitation at the jail is free but must be scheduled at least one day in advance and lasts for 20 minutes. At home video calls cost 450 credits for a 20 minute call and must also be set up at least one day in advance.

To fund Jason's commissary account which allows him to purchase needed/comfort items such as soap, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste and toothbrushes, snacks or activity books. Can be funded for any amount; a service fee is added to the amount you deposit (I think 10%). This account gives Jason the most freedom to determine how to spend any money that someone adds to the account (he said he can use it for phone and messages if necessary).

PAPERBACK books, which can be either for him to read or activity books, Suduku, crossword puzzles, word search, can be sent directly from Amazon or a bookstore such as Barnes and Noble or Books & Co. to:

As far as we know no other items can be sent directly to an inmate from Amazon or a bookstore, and items cannot be sent from any other seller.

With the exception of the US mail and books sent directly from Amazon or bookstore, you may be required to enter any or all of the following information to access Jason's account:

Addresses for US mail and book orders must be entered exactly as shown above. (Amazon has the address for the jail in their database and it autofilled the address for me after I typed line 1 and just a few characters from line 2)
