So in the church year, we are entering the "Season of Lent". A season is usually a specific time or length of time when something has changed from a previous season. Our church year begins with the season of Advent, then the season of Christmas, then the season of Epiphany, and now the season of Lent. As we begin the season, please let me make kind of a silly, but helpful suggestion; "Press the Pause button on the remote of Life". In other words, let's step back, temporarily put the world swirling around us on pause, and look again at why we have a season of Lent.

By the time you read this, we will have celebrated Transfiguration Sunday which is that Divine direction given by God for Jesus to begin his journey to the cross. Then for the next six weeks we are invited to travel with Jesus to the cross, of course culminating with the glorious Easter resurrection.

So as we hit the pause button:

- The ashen cross (Ash Wednesday) drawn upon our foreheads reminds us, and tells others we are serious about the Lenten journey with Jesus.
- Step back and give thanks for where you are and what you have,
- Examine your heart.
- Kneel down to repent and ask for forgiveness.
- Rise to mindful contemplation, prayer, and study as we journey together.

I am honored to make this journey again this year with the Christ followers of Zion Lutheran Church.

A Mid-Week Lenten Service will be held on Wednesday, March 8 at 6:00 PM. Light refreshment will be served. Please join us.



During Lent, the Adult Sunday School Class is studying "Seven Words: Listening to Christ from the Cross" by Susan Robb. She is the Senior Associate Minister at Highland Park United Methodist Church in Dallas. The six sessions are titled:

- Father, Forgive Them
- Today Will You Be with Me in Paradise
- My God, My God
- Woman, Here is Your Son
- I am Thirsty
- Into Your Hands

Each session looks at the words from Christ on the cross from a biblical and historical perspective. The series brings a hopeful and contemplative take on the cross during the weeks of Lent.



The Call Committee began interviewing candidates for Zion's pastor in July 2022. Since that time, we have interviewed 5 candidates. The first interview is through the Zoom format. If we decide we want a 2nd interview, we bring the candidate to meet in person. We have had three inperson interviews. Of the five candidates, we released two, meaning we did not feel the person was a good fit for Zion. Two of the candidates turned us down, citing that they did not feel the Holy Spirit calling them to Zion. One candidate accepted a position as the Assistant to the Bishop in another synod.

This process is not an easy or quick one. It involves reviewing candidates, waiting, praying, questioning, praying, waiting, excitement, praying, waiting, disappointment, and praying. We believe that God will find the right match for both Zion and our new pastor. Your prayers during this process are needed and appreciated.

PROPERTY COMMITTEE – February 6, 2023

Butler Heating and Cooling has completed the boiler and air conditioning installations in the 1894 building. Zion will receive a rebate from the gas supplier for putting in the new system. In addition, Zion will save money with 95% efficiency, which will reduce gas consumption. H & S Plumbing installed the new garbage disposal in the kitchen. D & T Electric completed installation of emergency lighting and exit lights throughout the building. James Sebastian continues to replace the old fluorescent bulbs with LED bulbs which eliminates ballasts, uses fewer bulbs and saves on energy costs. Thanks, James! Mega City replaced the control head for fire suppression in the range hood in the kitchen. The monthly work list was completed. The next meeting will be held on Monday, March 6, 2023 at 6:00 p.m.

At this past summer's Lutheran Church Musician's conference, one musician's work featured was Susan Palo Cherwien. I had heard the name Cherwien before (her husband David is an organist), but what I hadn't realized is the impact her poetry has on the Lutheran Church. Did you know that Susan Cherwien has 7 different hymn texts in *Evangelical*

Lutheran Worship and 8 different hymn texts in All Creation Sings? Cherwien is a native Ohioan, born in Ashtabula. Attending Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church (LCMS), she was baptized and confirmed there and sang in the children's and chancel choir. It was this love of music that led her to pursue of Bachelor of Music (Voice and Church Music) at Wittenberg (Ohio), from which she graduated in 1975. She spent 2 different periods of time in Berlin, Germany for additional education. She studied at Mundelein College in Chicago, IL, where she obtained her Master's Degree. It was here during a class called "The Fate of the Earth" that she wrote a hymn text sensitive to God's creation: In Sacred Manner (ACS 1071) One unique verse speaks to animal lovers:

5. In sacred manner may we live among the wise and loving ones, sit humbly, as at sages' feet, by four legged, finned, and feathered ones. The animals will teach. The animals will teach.

The choir recently sang one of her hymn texts during Epiphany: Holy Woman, Graceful Giver (ACS 1001). The first verse follows and is a single sentence!

Holy woman, graceful giver, prophet, servant, and believer, woman with the ointment jar, rose up near the time appointed, broke the seal, Christ's head anointed for the coming fatal hour, for the coming fatal hour.

We will be singing a Susan Cherwien hymn during Lent: ELW 447 *O Blessed Spring*. I selected 3 verses from the hymn to share.

- 4. As winter comes, as winters must, we breathe our last, return to dust; still held in Christ, our souls take wing and trust the promise of the spring.
- 1. O blessed spring, where word and sign embrace us into Christ the Vine: here Christ enjoins each one to be a branch of this life giving Tree.
- 5. Christ, holy Vine, Christ, living Tree, be praised for this blest mystery: that word and water thus revive and join us to your Tree of Life.

Susan Cherwien has 3 books of hymn poetry published (with new and veteran hymn tunes) by Augsburg Fortress, 3 hymn festival reflections published by Morning Star Publishers, and a variety of other arrangements composed based on her lyrics. She served on the ELCA Language Consultation which helped set guidelines before the Evangelical Lutheran Worship hymnal was developed. She was diagnosed with cancer shortly after Easter 2021 and passed away just after Christmas 2021. I imagine she continues to pen new and illustrative poetry in heaven.
