But then, Jesus cuts to the chase in verse 15 and asks "But who do you say that I am?" We only get a clear answer from Peter who boldly declares "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." So, we are left to wonder how the other disciples responded. If the Bible is the living Word of God, which I believe it is, then we are left with that same question of Jesus, "But who do you say that I am?" That question continues to be asked down through the ages, through church after church that takes seriously their adventures of faith with Jesus. The question still rings true today, Jesus asks "who do you say that I am?" We have the privilege of answering that question personally. We cannot answer for someone else, nor can they respond for us. It is a question that begs an answer, who do you say that Jesus is? Thanks for taking time to contemplate and respond to this timely question.

There are many opportunities for you to volunteer and we will need lots of helping hands to pull off this fundraiser. All proceeds benefit Zion's outreach ministries.

We need donations - furniture, toys, kitchen items, jewelry, linens, books, DVD's, CD's, tools, sporting goods, seasonal decorations, garden items, home decor, etc. We ask that all donated items be in **good, clean condition and in working order**. We **Do NOT accept** clothing, bed pillows, TVs, treadmills or large exercise equipment, car seats, estate or garage sale leftovers.

Donations can be brought to the Fellowship Hall beginning Saturday, September 16 before or after the 5:00 service, Sunday, Sept. 17 after service until 4:00, Monday and Tuesday, Sept. 18 & 19 until noon. #### Simply Give

The Needy Basket Food Pantry is participating in the Meijer *Simply Give* program at the Troy store now through Sept. 30. The program encourages customers to purchase

In addition, any cards purchased on Saturday, Sept. 9, effectively tripling contributions made on that day. Life Line Screening, the nation's leading provider of preventive health screenings, will offer affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings at Zion Lutheran Church on Wednesday, October 4, 2023.

A package of four screenings to identify risk for stroke, heart disease and other chronic conditions will be offered:

#### **Carotid Artery Screening (Plaque)**

An ultrasound is performed to screen the carotid arteries (a pair of blood vessels in the neck that deliver blood to your brain) for buildup of fatty plaque. This buildup, called atherosclerosis, is one of the leading causes of stroke.

#### **Peripheral Arterial Disease Screening**

An Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) test is performed using blood pressure cuffs on the arms and legs. It is important to screen for PAD because it increases the risk of coronary artery disease, heart attack, or stroke.<sup>1</sup>

#### **Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA)**

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm. AAA can lead to a ruptured aortic artery, which is a serious medical emergency.

#### **Atrial Fibrillation**

A 6-lead electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for Atrial Fibrillation. AFib can lead to blood clots, stroke, and heart failure, and other heart-related complications.<sup>2</sup>

#### **Caring Creations**

Next time you are walking from the Walnut Street entrance to the sanctuary, stop at the newly renovated table and cupboard in the hallway. It has always been about several great ministries in this church but had gotten too cluttered to be understandable. Take a minute to see the many ways we "Serve Christ through Serving Others" and see if there are ways you can contribute. You don't have to be a sewer, but they would love to have help in that area



too. If you can cut fabric, tie knots, insert drawstrings in bags, sew on buttons, stuff filling, knit, crochet, stamp, color or make deliveries, you can help.

**Prayer Shawl Ministry** - If you knit, crochet, or sew, they would like to use your skill to share God's love with others. Since the Prayer Shawl Ministry began in 2019, 14 men and 39 women have been blessed with prayer shawls. Also, they have blessed 17 babies with baby blankets. Thanks to George Hackbardt, Brad Kennedy, and Susie Gray they have LOTS of yarn for our knitters and crocheters to use. They can also use people who would be willing to deliver prayer shawls and baby blankets. If you would be interested in making prayer shawls or baby blankets, or delivering them, please contact Debbie Rudisill for more information. Also contact Debbie if you know someone who needs to receive a prayer shawl or baby blanket.

Mission Quilts – The quilters create between 150-200 quilts per year that are sent to Lutheran World Relief, the Veterans Hospital and needy families at Christmas. If you can cut fabric, tie knots or sew, they can use your help. Contact Kathy Groth or Maggie Powder if you have questions or wish to help.

**Hospice** of Miami County can use clothing protectors, either sewn or made from towels with a crocheted top, neck pillows, aromatherapy pads, hand massagers, walker bags, foley bags (that hold catheter bags), wheelchair bags and activity mats for dementia patients. If you can cut fabric, stuff filling, sew, crochet, or sew on buttons, they can use your help.

The Veterans Hospital can use walker bags, wheelchair bags, drawstring bags and foley bags. If you can sew or insert drawstrings, they would love your assistance.

Caring Cards ministry also contributes to veterans by sending them hand stamped and colored cards. If you can stamp or color, they can use your skills.
