What Grounds You?

I remember being "grounded" once in high school for taking my 1936 Ford for a joy ride up the neighbor's long lane before the car was officially licensed to be on the highway. Our grandchildren will occasionally remark that they have been "grounded" temporarily for an infraction of family guidelines. While those stories are usually kind of fun to remember, I have a different kind of "grounded" question today. As I watch/listen to the local, national international news, I am becoming increasingly concerned about the great divide that shows up on most every issue from churches to schools, to communities, to countries. Where is the "common ground" that provides a safe place for disagreeing parties to come together to do the hard work of reconciliation.

But, before we can answer that question, I/we must first answer to the question "what grounds me?", where am I grounded? What gives us strength to take the next steps when there is so much unrest around us? In Matthew 22:15ff, the Pharisees sought to entrap Jesus with a question about whether it was legal to pay taxes. Jesus knew their intent, so He asked for a coin, and asked whose image was on the coin. They answered of course, Caesar. So, Jesus said render unto Caesar what is Caesar's and unto God what belongs to God.

If you will, therein lies the answer to what grounds us! All that we have, all that we are, and all that we will ever be belongs to God. So, being reminded that we were created in the image of God, and that our loyalty is first to the sovereign God who created the universe, in the midst of swirling uncertainly around us, we can remain grounded in the promise that God in Christ Jesus will never abandon us.

Ornaments for Hospice


