THE WORD

FIRST READING: Isaiah 64:1-9

R: ¹O that You would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at Your presence—²as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil—to make Your name known to Your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at Your presence! ³When You did awesome deeds that we did not expect, You came down, the mountains quaked at Your presence. ⁴From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides You, who works for those who wait for Him.

⁵You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember You in Your ways. But You were angry, and we sinned; because You hid yourself we transgressed. ⁶We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a filthy cloth. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. ⁷There is no one who calls on Your name, or attempts to take hold of You; for You have hidden Your face from us, and have delivered us into the hand of our iniquity. ⁸Yet, O LORD, You are our Father; we are the clay, and You are our potter; we are all the work of Your hand. ⁹Do not be exceedingly angry, O LORD, and do not remember iniquity forever. Now consider, we are all Your people.
