How Do You View the World?

"So as David stood there among his brothers, Samuel took the flask of olive oil he had brought and anointed David with the oil". 1 Samuel 15:13

Have you ever thought about your view of the world? Where does it come from? Have you ever thought about how you see things, judge things, decide things? As Christians this is an important question for us, because God sees things and does things very differently than the world.

In 1 Samuel, we hear the story of David, a small-town shepherd boy being God's choice as future King. If Samuel was following the ways of the world, he would have anointed one of David's 7 older brothers as King, but God had other plans. This idea that God sees things differently than the world should be good news. It is the world that puts doubts in our head, tells us we are not good enough. But God sees us for who we are. God made us. He knows how many hairs each of us have on our heads. He knows our gifts, and knows our true worth. But when we follow the ways of the world it is easy to forget that everyone is precious in God's eyes. We begin to judge others according to the world. We begin to think we are better than those who the world has labeled as insignificant – better because we have more money, dress nicer, better looking or because we have white skin or light skin. It is important that we remember that God doesn't judge as the world judges. God isn't impressed with anyone's pocketbook or list of achievements – God isn't going to be sweet talked or charmed. All God cares about is our heart – do we seek the Lord, and do we look out for our neighbors? What is insignificant to the world is significant to God.

Zion History Part 5 Correction

A previous Zion pastor, Tom Heil, called to tell me there was an error in last month's history. The history I have been putting in Tidings was written by William Posey in 2000 and is in the "175 Years of Blessings" booklet. If you have one, you can make the correction in your copy. In the final paragraph it said the Feghtly Home was disbanded by the Synod in the mid-sixties. Tom said that happened in the 80's when he was pastor here and his wife helped to relocate the women who had been residing there. As a side note, he told me that his wife also worked to establish the "HandiVan" to assist with transporting handicapped individuals.

Zion History Part 6

The late eighteen hundreds and early nineteen hundreds saw the organization of many church affiliated groups such as The Young People's Missionary Society, The Women's Home and Foreign Missionary Society, The Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor, The Ladies Aid Society and the Luther League. This by no means lists them all, but gives us an idea of just how central the workings of the church were in the lives of our members at that time. Bible study was much in vogue with our church boasting a Men's Bible Study Class exceeding one hundred gentlemen. Sunday School attendance was also so good it prompted the 1906 expansion of the classrooms.

The then vacant lot on the northwest corner of Third and Main was purchased in 1916 from the heirs of the John Kantz estate for five thousand dollars. At the time of purchase a fine house, the home of the Kantz family, was moved to a location on North Third Street where it still stands. The acquisition of the Kantz property proved most valuable in establishing Zion's prominence in the city. The clearing away of the Kantz house opened the corner to an unobstructed view of the church, and afforded the opportunity for landscaping and the installation of our church sign. No finer location currently exists.

This now was the time of the First World War. The years of 1916, 1917 and 1918 were full of the concerns of a country at war. Many of our young men were off to do the Kaiser in. Some of them never returned. The ladies of the church spent many hours rolling bandages and preparing gift packages for shipment to France. Pastor William Guard (1914-1922) made many home calls during this terrible time, not only to our members but also to many others receiving the dreaded news from the front.

The parsonage built in 1862 on the southwest corner of Third and Main Streets was moved in 1920 to its present location just behind the Kantz lot on Third Street. The corner lot, which it occupied, was then sold to the Standard Oil Company. Standard Oil constructed a service station there, which remained until it was sold to the Methodist Church. The property now serves as their church parking lot. The parsonage, known as "The Parish House," was well utilized for church offices and meeting rooms. This fine old building was used as our parsonage until 1968 with Pastor Don Bridinger (1964-1970) and his family being the last occupants. The building remained much as originally constructed with only fragmented internal remodeling. The use of a parsonage for the occupancy of a pastor and his or her family has become obsolete for most congregations, as pastors now prefer to acquire a home of their own.


