Help Needed at the Clothesline

The Clothesline in Tipp City is a clothing resale shop started in 1981. It is run by volunteers from the churches in Tipp City. The proceeds go to local charities. Zion provides volunteers that sort (the "sorters") donated clothing and remove clothing (referred as the "pullers") that has not sold for a designated time period.



The sorters go through the donated clothes and the articles that show minimal wear are kept for resale. The clothes with evidence of wear are donated to missions. The sorters volunteer every second and fifth Mondays in the morning. It is ideal to have 5-6 sorters. It usually takes 2-2 1/2 hours to do this task depending on the amount of donated clothing for the week.

The clothing that is removed by the pullers is taken to missions by the pullers. This makes room for other merchandise. This task is done by Zion volunteers every Monday morning for 2 months out of the year. It is also ideal to have 5-6 volunteers to pull. Once again it takes $2 - 2 \frac{1}{2}$ hours to complete.

The participating Tipp Churches are each given money every 3 months with a year-end bonus depending on the Clothesline's total income for the year. The money is to be used for their designated mission of choice. This amount is calculated by the number of hours the sorters and clerks volunteer. In 2022 Zion received \$3,135.44 and in 2023 - \$5,209.00. 2024 is pending since a bonus is calculated at the end of the year.

The advantages of volunteering at the clothesline are: 1) it's a low stress, fun time with our Zion members, 2) you get to meet other people in the Tipp church community, 3) you get first selection of the merchandise (many of your Zion family probably have a Clothesline item on right now!!), 4) you feel you are fulfilling Zion's mission when you're there, knowing you are serving others in the community, missions, and our church.

Please consider volunteering. At present, Zion has the lowest number of pullers and sorters. If you would like to be a backup to the regular Zion volunteers that would be great too. Both men and women are needed. Call me with questions/comments.
