#### **Trust in the Lord**

"And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me."

(Matthew 28:18)

"[Jesus] is Lord of lords and King of kings..." (Revelation 17:14)

"Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you..." (Matthew 5:44-45)

There is a lot of anxiety this November and I think we all know why. It was four years ago that we had our last presidential election, and so the time has come for us to elect our next President to begin serving in January of 2025. Many people are worried about who will be elected in what has been a tightly contested race. Know this: as your pastor I will never tell you who to vote for. It is not my job to tell you to vote for one candidate or another. It is not my job to advocate for one party or another. However, it is my job to remind you to put God first. Pray over both candidates, ask God to give you the wisdom of discernment, and seek to vote for the candidate you believe will be best for our community and our neighbors. Most importantly, vote your conscience. Vote for the person you believe will do the most amount of good for our nation and for the world.

John Wesley, the founder of Methodism had this to say in 1774 when elections were being held: "I met those of our society who had votes in the ensuing election, and advised them: 1. To vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy. 2. To speak no evil of the person they voted against. 3. To take care their spirits were not sharpened against those who voted on the other side." (Journal of John Wesley– October 6, 1774). I believe that John Wesley's admonitions still stand. My friends, let us remember the golden rule: "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you." (Matthew 7:12)

More importantly, let us remember that we do not rely on the President for salvation. Kamala Harris and Donald Trump are not going to save you. You may like their policies, but they are not sovereign over all of creation. My friends, we pledge allegiance to a higher power. We pledge allegiance to the Lamb, not to the elephant or donkey. It is Jesus to whom our allegiance belongs. Christ is Lord! And if Christ is Lord, then Caesar is not. The President is not. Vote for whom you think is best, but please remember to keep God at the center. And I will join you in praying for all involved in this election and pray that God may guide our country into a promising future.


## Let's Show Off Our Hospitality


