# **The Cross and Community**

The cross is the ultimate symbol of community. The cross of Christ reveals that we were created for relationship. Take a look at the cross. Notice that there is a horizontal beam and a vertical beam. The horizontal beam tells us that we are called to be in relationship with those around us, here on this earth. We are called to enter into relationship with our neighbors, with our friends, with our families. The vertical beam tells us that we are called to enter into relationship with God. More specifically, God seeks to have a relationship with us. Taken together, the entirety of the cross reveals God's redemption of human and divine relationships. Jesus, the God-man, enters into our world to save us so that we may be in right relationship with our fellow humans and with God.

As we continue through the end of Lent and look forward to the beautiful celebration of Easter, let us reflect on the relationships in our lives, whether at church, at home, or in the wider community. Who has God brought into your life and what is God seeking for your relationship? How is your relationship with God, with your family, with the church? And what is God calling you to do about it? I think our relationships are incredibly important to pray over. As the poet John Donne wrote, "no man is an island."

# **Gather: Miami Valley**

The Southern Ohio Synod launched its Cultivate initiative in 2021 to grow our church through experimentation with new forms of church and outreach.



These are our growing edges in a rapidly changing mission field, and what we learn in these ministries

can be put to good use in all our congregations as we all learn together the most effective ways to share the good news of God's love through Jesus Christ today.

Gather: Miami Valley is a ministry by and for young adults in the greater Dayton area, currently being "fostered" by Pastor Andrew Thompson (Abiding Christ, Fairborn) and Pastor Benjamin Prill (St. John's, Vandalia) of Lutheran Saints in Ministry.

Starting in November of 2024, young adults from across the greater Dayton-Springfield region began to gather twice a month for fun fellowship, deep conversations, and good food. They join a nationwide network made up of other regional, young adult communities across the broader ELCA, which is now 27 Gather groups strong! Gather communities serve to provide a space, for any and all young adults (age 18 through their 30's) to come together with others in this stage of life, that is full of deep joy, discovery, and transformation. By coming together with others with such deep common ground, all are rejuvenated and as a bonus, can dive back into their respective communities, including church communities, with even greater passion and energy.

They currently meet every second Saturday at 2:30 pm to 4:00 pm for discussions on topics offered up by participants, and every fourth Tuesday evening from 7:00 to 8:30 pm for a social event somewhere in the community. # **Family Abuse Shelter**

Family Abuse Shelter of Miami County

On March 16, Laura Huston from the Family Abuse Shelter in Troy spoke during the 10:00 service about the mission of the Shelter. This is a service that serves homeless and abused men and women in Miami County. If you would like more information about this, their website is <a href="www.familyabusesheltermc.org">www.familyabusesheltermc.org</a>. Their mission is to provide safe shelter to homeless and abused people in times of crisis and to offer life-changing services promoting stability, dignity, and self-reliance. Zion has two ongoing collection bins inside the parking lot door.

The items needed are:

Pots and pans, cooking utensils, silverware, sippy cups, blankets, new sheets and pillows, towels and washcloths, new small appliances, baby lotion, body wash, shampoo, baby food, diapers sizes 4, 5, and 6, hair brushes, deodorant, toothbrushes and toothpaste, and tampons. Take home lists are on the "Help" board. Volunteers are also crucial in various capacities.


# **Quilt Display**

## **Worship & Music Committee Report**

On Wednesday, March 19, 2025, the Worship and Music Committee met. Attending were: Carla Frame, Susie Gray, Bill Jones, Deb Keppel, Lori Sebastian, and Pastor Summers. Pastor began the meeting in prayer.

Lori thanked the following individuals: Annette for all her work with the bulletins, especially for getting all the music in for the Sunday Lenten services, those who helped with Joyce Zimmann's retirement reception, and Grant Johnson – our new Saturday night musician.

Here are the upcoming dates for our worship services:

Bill stated that he and Susie have selected music for the remainder of the year. We are still puzzled by a couple missing anthems. For Easter, 2 pieces are planned. Lori stated the bell choir will ring on Sunday April 27 and will ring again sometime in June.

Carla stated that the Altar Committee is running smoothly. Communion – at the rail – was done Ash Wednesday and will be done Maundy Thursday, and traffic flow went more smoothly. The palms are ordered for Palm Sunday. We will order 6 dozen carnations from Always Blooming for Mothers' Day. Pastor will be starting Confirmation in the fall, so we will not have a Spring Confirmation service.

For Lent, we returned to Setting 3 – specifically restoring the Kyrie (Lord, Have Mercy) and the chanting. We will add back in *This is the Feast, Alleluia Verse*, and *Thankful Hearts* for Easter, and omit the chanting. We discussed the summer liturgy, and the consensus was to do something simple. Then, we could move back into a liturgical setting in the fall. Lastly, Saturday night service started using All Creation Sings.

For the video team, the camera has some connectivity issues (faulty plug/cable). According to Pastor Summers, once the property committee and A/V team install additional wiring, we can add microphones and speakers for use in the congregation and taking video can be done upstairs.
