There Is Life

Christ is Risen! Alleluia! This Easter, I want to focus on the life we see around us. The resurrection of Christ tells us that God is a life-giving God. When God is present, there is life. Easter affirms that our God is a Living God. A God who is active in our world, in our community, in our lives. When I look around at our family here at Zion, I see God on the move. I see God at work. My friends, there is life! There is life all around us! This congregation has life. Let us affirm it. Let us celebrate it. Let us find joy and peace in the life God has given us.

Now, I can hear you asking, "Pastor, where is this life?" I get it. Sometimes it's hard to see. Allow me to point out only a few of the many experiences of life I see here at Zion. I see life in the way our community cares for one another. For the prayers we share, for the cards we write, for the calls we make. I see life in the way we support our children and youth. We celebrate the fact that they are with us— in worship, in our community, in our activities. They are an incredible part of our community. There is life in our worship, in the ministries we offer to our community. From the occasional Bunco night to a Brat Dinner and beyond, there is life everywhere I look.

I see life in the way we welcome guests and visitors. In the ways we approach them before or after service, welcoming them into our community. This is so important. Life is never meant to be confined to the four walls of a building but is meant to be shared with the world around us, particularly the people we encounter. We have had over 15 people join our congregation since September and when I speak with them, they tell me how they value the authenticity they find in this place. Authenticity that allows them to form relationships with God and with others. I mean, we literally ran out of seats on Christmas Eve as the sanctuary was filled up with 221 people. Let us celebrate this and then let's forget the numbers, because numbers are not ultimately important. Seeing God at work is where our attention should be focused. Numbers are simply one tool among many we use to see where God is at work in the world around us.

The Living God is here and at work. I see this as we plan for our 200th anniversary next year, as we work with other churches in the area, especially St. John's and St. Paul Lutheran churches in Vandalia. There is life as we sit in Chaffee's drinking coffee, tea, and beer, talking about how our faith impacts the way we live in the world. And don't let me forget Gather: Miami Valley, our young adult ministry in partnership with Lutheran churches throughout Dayton.

From quilting on a Tuesday morning to council meetings in the evening. Everywhere I look I see life. I hope that you can see it too. We are not "just a small church" as I have heard some parishioners sigh in conversation. (side note: 80% of churches in the United States have less than 100 people. Small churches aren't small, they're normal.) We are Christ's church. God has called for Zion to be here for a reason. We have a mission to follow and Good News to share throughout Tipp City and beyond. And that mission is to share life. To affirm life. To celebrate life. Let us reflect on this God-life as we remember the Risen Lord this Easter season.






