## What Does the Pastor Do?

The most common question I get, whenever I introduce myself as a pastor to others, is "what do you do all day?" Most people who learn that I am a pastor ask what I do throughout the week. "Obviously, you work on Sundays. But what about the rest of the time?" They assume I do nothing except prepare for Sunday service. I have been asked this question so many times that I thought it would be good to devote an article towards answering this question. Maybe you have asked this question before, or maybe you will have friends or family members who ask this same question. Nevertheless, I think it is important for people to know what their pastor does week in and week out.

The one thing that people should know is that my schedule changes week by week, depending on what events are happening in the community and in our congregation. Throughout the week, I spend time studying the lectionary texts for the upcoming week and then writing my sermon. I work with staff to plan worship, youth events, congregational events, etc. My goal is to support our staff as they go about their ministries by providing theological guidance and pastoral perspective. I typically visit folks in their homes and in the hospital every week. Depending on the severity of the situation I may visit someone every day, once a week, or once a month. Planning is also needed for congregational events, Council and committee meetings, and ministry offerings–from Bible and Brew to Gather: Miami Valley (our young adult ministry). Weekly, I meet with other Lutheran pastors in the area to study the lectionary texts and I will occasionally meet with local pastors in Tipp City to build relationships with our neighbors. Sometimes, I will go to a local business/gathering space to read scripture, pray, and engage with the community. I have taken a liking to spending Thursday mornings at Chaffee's Brewhouse where I can interact with members of the community and learn about the needs of our neighbors.

As a pastor, I work six days out of the week– Saturday through Thursday. Fridays are my day off. Depending on what happens during the week, I will take additional time when I can. On average, I work about 45-50 hours a week. Sometimes less, sometimes more. Everything I have described above is "typical" on a weekly basis. But there are always things popping up that are not typical. There are events or situations that arise that you cannot plan for. Not to mention funerals and weddings. In other words, this article barely scratches the surface of what I do in a week. But I tell you that I love being a pastor. I can't imagine doing anything else. This calling is so fulfilling and so life-giving that it truly doesn't feel like work. Do I get tired? Yes! Do I get stressed? Yes! But overall, I am happier than I ever imagined I could be. I love this calling that God has placed on my life and I love being your pastor at Zion Lutheran Church. Week in and week out, there are so many things I get to do. Ministry is never boring! And I truly enjoy being out

in the community, helping others in their discipleship and equipping the saints in their vocations. Being a pastor is truly a blessing.

On Wednesday, May 7, 2025, the Worship and Music Committee met. Attending were: Brittany Fouts, Carla Frame, Susie Gray, Bill Jones, Lori Sebastian, and Pastor Jaren Summers. Pastor began the meeting in prayer. We reviewed Holy Week. We talked about the possibility of a survey and a hymn sing sometime this summer as special music. We discussed some ideas for the sanctuary, to commemorate the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary. We also arranged coverage for weeks when musicians will be out of town. In addition, we discussed the Church Picnic.

Our upcoming service dates include: Mother's Day – May 11 & 12 (each woman will receive a carnation), Pentecost - June 7 & 8, and Holy Trinity – June 14 & 15. On Sunday June 15<sup>th</sup>, Adena Brass will be providing special music.

## How Can I Get Involved?

We are so happy to welcome new people to our congregation. We've been asked about ways to plug in to activities. To provide information about the multitude of opportunities, this is the first of a new ongoing section in Tidings, which describes a specific ministry area and ways to become involved. This month we are highlighting **Christian Education**.

Christian Education aims at helping adults and youth futher their spiritual growth to become closer to the Lord through classes. These classes are offered September (the Sunday after Labor Day) through May (the 2 weeks before Memorial Day) on Sunday mornings 9:00 am to 9:45 am. There are different classes available: current classes include Adult, Youth (5<sup>th</sup> grade+), and children (K-4<sup>th</sup>).

We are always looking for help with Sunday School!

If you are interested in helping with **Adult Sunday School** (Sundays at 9) please contact Linda Holt or Jessica Dorn.

If you are interested in helping with **Youth, Children, or Toddler Sunday School** please contact Jessica Dorn. Those who help with children and youth must have a clean background check to ensure the safety of our children.

**Sunday School Teachers** are asked to sign up for one week (or more) a month for the entire Sunday School year so that relationships are formed between the teacher and children. Teachers are given the curriculm for their week, and have a box which has all of the supplies that are needed. Teachers are encouraged to check their box before they lead to make sure that everything they need is in the box.

**Sunday School Helpers** are asked to sign up for a week (or more) a month for the entire school year. This helps the children build a relationship with the helpers. Helpers are encouraged to come into the Sunday School room and particiapte with the children to model good behavior and to help anywhere the teacher or children need help. Class helpers are important not only to have another trusted adult connection, but also to keep the classrooms a safe place for everyone.

**Christian Education Advisory Committee** is comprised of Sunday School Teachers, Helpers, and anyone who has an interest in Sunday School. This committee guides the Christian Education Director in the correct direction that christian education is handled at Zion. They typically meet 3-4 times a year (before Sunday School begins, mid year, and after Sunday School is completed). The meeting time will be announced in the church bulletin.
